Our people have experienced that and our faith has been the source of strength. To Act: Getting involved without fear, with determination, trusting God To Celebrate: Lord, give us your water Going out: daring to overcome barriers and challenges	Approach the person with genuine interest. Start a respectful dialogue. Express interest in understanding their environment. Inviting the person to identify a periphery and reflect on the struggles that exist there.	1. To Act: Inviting Jesus personally and in community To Celebrate: Ritual pages 31-32	Maintain relationship with the person with various gestures. Have we found in the Eucharist nourishment and the enthusiasm to go out in mission?  There are many fears that we still need to let go to be able to become a community.
